

The Scrap Bin

I would like to follow up on Craig's rather cryptic remarks about the tip I gave him concerning white glue that he used on his airplane.

He told me about gluing sheeting on the foam wing, I think, which caused me to remember a technique for bonding white-glued surfaces with heat.

Try this out on any two items, but you need to be able to pass heat through one of them. Put a thinned coating of white glue on the two surfaces to be joined. The thinnest coming is enough. Let them dry. Position as desired and apply heat with your covering iron. You will find it impossible to separate the two pieces.

What has happened technically is that the heat has caused the two dried glue coatings to polymerize, or join together. Similar to a CA joint, it is a molecular bond, and is therefore very strong.

A word of warning. There is no second chance, so you must be certain the parts are exactly as desired, with no bucking or puckering. I have used it on sheeting to foam, balsa to balsa and Formica to counter!

I learned this from a metallurgist in the mid-1970's.

I have also used Gorilla glue to reattach a broken piece of concrete and it lasted well over 10 years in sunlight and all temperatures until the day it was removed. It never failed.
