As with most Sig kits, the instruction book was straight forward, laser cut parts were very good, as well as the balsa provided. At present, just finishing building, then onto covering. Haven't decided on the color scheme yet. The engine being installed is an O.S. 46. This should be a reliable engine for this plane.

On a different subject, I ran across a book that was very hard to put down. Titled "Shattered Sword-The Untold Story of the Battle of Midway" by Parshall and Tully. It gives a Japanese history leading up to the battle, a very detailed account of the planning, how the plans were executed, and what went wrong with the battle at Midway. It includes Japanese Naval Doctrine, officers in charge, covers timelines, entire fleet of ships as well as aircraft used. Over 600+ pages including charts, maps, ship designations, etc. Also debunks some reporting from Western historians. Truly a fascinating book. I highly recommend this book to folks interested in WWII Pacific battles.


