Owatonna is really a hidden jewel in the idyllic farm country of Southern Minnesota. Field is 1,200 ft long WNW to ESE only two hours from Ames, so not a bad day trip if you only want to fly one day or just spectate. It's my favorite because it's a World-class event with over 100 pilots and 3 X that many planes, but organizers work hard to keep it friendly and humble and open to everyone.

This year half a dozen of us attended and weather was near perfect and some real beauties were flown

I keep promising myself I will go up there one year and just watch, instead of standing on my head tuning engines, then stressing out over flying in front of >100 pilots, >80% of whom are better than I am. But I never have.





2)Fond du Lac is like Owatonna on steroids. It's 6 hours away, but the field is a 1,600 X 1,200 ft putting green and about 150 pilots attend every year, with at least 500 planes. Some really big names with big jet planes and all the usual Thunderbolts and Mustangs, and yes, there are some arrogant attitudes that can be intimidating, but WHAT A SHOW! And if you dare to fly in front of guys who have won European championships with \$28,000 twin turbines, all you gotta do is grab your spotter and go stand in line like everybody else!

Instead of the standard rows of pop-up tents at Owatonna, they are now trending towards massive 60x20 ft circus tents that are set up and taken down for regional groups of flyers (for a fee). For example, 14 Minneapolis flyers paid \$75 each for a huge shared tent. Well worth it if it gets rainy.

This year was kind of a wash for me because Thursday rained and I set up the same three WWII beasties, then Friday and Saturday featured a pure west 10-15 mph crosswind that intimidated me into only flying the P-61 once, and I kinda biffed that landing, spent some more time standing on my head in the pits. It didn't intimidate the regional and national champions, who flew steadily all day, and CRASHED steadily all day! In all my 30 years of RC, I don't think I've seen anywhere close to that much carnage.

Radcliffe is Dwayne's private field, only 35 miles away and a very friendly intimate gathering to help you kind of unwind from the above intensity. Always attended by a World class aerobatic helicopter pilot and his equal son from Storm Lake, and of course Dwayne alone has a finer bomber collection than you will see at

most airshows. Field is very wellgroomed, 600 ft long N-S
